If you are new, remember to feed solid food; fondant, bee candy, or even granulated sugar on the inner cover. Additionally, this time of year, also remember to NEVER feed syrup, as it is still too cold for liquids.

This year, our club is going to strive to pair new beekeepers with beeks with more experience, so at our upcoming meetings, please look for someone you can help or partner with this year. Or, please see John Gaut to volunteer.

Also, always remember that the club exists for you, so if there is something that you would like to see the club do, please speak up and let us know.

This is going to a great year! The club officers have been busy brainstorming and planning to make 2015 the best year yet. And, it all starts at this Friday's meeting, and I look forward to seeing you there!
